Congratulations to all the winners of the 2018 Prospect General Election! This year See's two Council Members retain their seats and four brand new Council Members take their place on the dais! Council Member Sandra Leonard and Council Member Frank Fulcher were both re-elected to new terms in office. Four fresh faces will be appearing on the council come January 1st when they are sworn in. Council Member-elect Harold Schewe, Council Member-elect Richard Overy, Council Member-elect Rande Swann and Council Member-elect Greg Huelsman all placed in the top six in total votes.

Mayor John Evans retained his position in a landslide victory. John starts his sixth year as Mayor of Prospect, after being appointed to the position in July of 2013 when Mayor Corey stepped down. 10 if you count the four years as mayor served from 1981 to 1984.
