

**CITY OF PROSPECT
ORDINANCE NO. 584, SERIES 2019**

**AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE AMENDMENT AND MODIFICATION OF
CHAPTER 114.06 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROSPECT
WITH REGARDS TO SUNDAY BY THE DRINK LIQUOR AND WINE SALES**

WHEREAS, Chapter 114.06 establishes the circumstances in which distilled spirits and wine may be sold on Sundays in the City of Prospect; and

WHEREAS, Gustavo's desires to start serving distilled spirits and wine for Sunday brunch; and

WHEREAS, Metro Louisville allows for expanded by the drink sales of distilled spirits and wine on Sundays; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend the code of ordinances to allow restaurants in Prospect possessing a Sunday retail drink license to sell distilled spirits and wine for Sunday brunch.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 114.06 is hereby amended and modified as hereinafter set forth with old language struck through, changes and new language being underlined and reading as follows:

§ 114.06 SUNDAY RETAIL DRINK LICENSE.

(A) In addition to those other licenses authorized herein, the city shall issue a special sunday retail drink license to any person who holds a license to sell at retail, liquor and wine by the drink and who otherwise qualifies for such a license in accordance with the provisions of KRS Chapter 243, as amended, upon payment in advance to the city of the sum of \$300.

(B) Sales of alcoholic beverages on Sunday pursuant to the license granted under division (A) of this section shall permit the sale of distilled spirits and wine by the drink on Sunday from ~~4:00 p.m.~~ 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 a.m. Monday by hotels, motels and restaurants which are licensed for the retail sale of distilled spirits and wine by the drink and which have dining facilities with a minimum seating capacity of 100 people at tables and which receive at least 50% or more of their gross annual income from their dining facilities by the sale of food in accordance with KRS 244.290.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.


Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, signing, and publication as required by law.
